(Acts 2:17-18)

Grace and peace to you my sisters and brothers in Christ,
We are approaching the end of our Easter season. We are now starting to focus our attention on Pentecost and the Sundays after Pentecost. The word "Pentecost" comes from the Greek word тєレтпкобтท́ (pentékosté) which means "fiftieth." In Hebrew, it’s called 'Shavuot', which means "weeks." Jewish Pentecost falls on the fiftieth day after the original Passover. On this day, God gave the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai. In ancient Palestine, there were two harvests each year: an early harvest in May and June, and a final harvest in the fall. Pentecost celebrated the beginning of the early wheat harvest. It always fell sometime during the middle of May or early June.

For us as Christians we celebrate Pentecost in a new way. For us Pentecost marks the coming of the Holy Spirit 50 days after Easter Sunday as described in the book of Acts. During Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came upon Jesus' disciples like tongues of fire while they were gathered in Jerusalem. They began to speak in other tongues or the languages of people who gathered in Jerusalem that day from different parts of the world and they all heard them speaking in their own languages.

If during the construction of the tower of Babel, God confused the people with languages so they would not be able to communicate with each other to build the tower. During the Pentecost however, God did just the opposite; God used the languages to unify people and to understand the good news of God. Pentecost is often referred to as the birth of the church because it marked the beginning of God's universal or global mission.

The Sundays after Pentecost is the longest season of the church. The season is often called 'Ordinary' season or 'Green Sundays'. The color of the paraments during this season is green, and signifies the growth of the church. Throughout this season, all our Scriptural readings especially the gospels will focus on Jesus' public ministry; teaching, preaching and healing.

The verses above remind us that in Pentecost and beyond, God pours out his Holy Spirit to all people; young and old, slave and free. In our baptism, God sustains us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit; 'the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of council and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in God's presence, now and forever'. During this season we focus not only the growth of the church, but our individual growth as we live out our baptismal promises.

## WALKING WITH CHRIST



Artistically, a banner could be compared to a billboard. It should offer in a few words and symbols a meaningful message to the viewer. It should be bold, direct and visually easy to read.

It was the hope of the artist that the congregation would be willing to shorten the newly adopted mission statement to read "Walking with Christ...loving serving". It should be understood that this is not to change the statement but only to condense it for the sake of impact and instant reading.

We are reminded in the Easter story that upon meeting his followers Jesus was not recognized until an explanation had been given. Remembering that, Jesus has been portrayed on the banner symbolically. With a hand on a staff we are reminded of Jesus the Shepherd leading his sheep as they walk down a path. The path is white representing the Light of Christ guiding the way. The image is rather austere giving the feeling of a shadow.

All the colors used on the banner are the ecumenical colors of the church calendar. The calendar being a day by day account of the entire year so Christ loves and serves all of His children daily. Thus, we must follow His example and Walk in His ways loving and serving every day. Artistically all the colors used on the banner are those of the paraments and other cloths used on the altar throughout the church year. Thus, no matter the season all of the colors are always coordinated.
"Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me". The Shepherd used the rod for a two fold purpose. It was used to gently tap the sheep and assure them they were on the right path. In that way it was used as a tool of comfort. The staff was also used to discipline the sheep. If the sheep strayed off course they were quickly and sternly grabbed by the staff and pulled back on track. The sheep knew they were either doing well or needed to get back to task. "Spare the rod spoil the child" so to speak! None the less both served to make the sheep feel secure in what they were doing.

It is hoped that many of you would find it rewarding to meet and carve or paint your own walking stick. It would serve as a reminder of the joy of "walking with Christ". You need not be talented, just eager. I recall when we worked together making the stations of the cross, many thought we could never accomplish that, but we did and had a good time doing it. Tell me if you are interested. Let's see if we can't get a group together and Walk With Christ by way of making our own walking stick to remind us of our daily mission. Thank you for your interest while being given a brief explanation of the thought process for this particular banner. Anything you may have read into it would be fun to hear.

Without the director of youth the budget has a deficit of $\$ 41,000$. Either way your contributions are being put to good use in our congregation, community, and around the world. We do have a reserve to cover a shortfall, but wish to conserve this reserve as much as we can.
