COUNCIL UPDATE

from Council President, Roger Miller Visioning Process Update

It is part of our council's commitment to inform our congregation with our council's deliberations and decisions for the life and ministry of the church. As part of our visioning process, last year our church conducted another visioning exercise led by Kathleen Breitenstein focusing on what ministry activity/ies that we need to start, continue or stop by using the traffic lights analogy; Green (start), Yellow (continue) and Red (stop). We encouraged all our members to submit their inputs for those three categories.

On behalf of the council, Kathleen Breitenstein and Sarah Pryor then compiled all the data that were submitted, processed, categorized, assigned them into appropriate committees then they submitted the findings to the council.

During our council retreat on April 27, the council decided to share those findings with the appropriate committees to discuss, prioritize and adjust them with their SMART(IE) goals as necessary. They will share their top priority recommendations back to council. From their

recommendations, we hope to be able to define our church's top priorities and be able to set our short and long term goals and implement them.

We are grateful that we are still going through this visioning process, we have begun to capture God's vision and defined our new mission statement or statement of purpose, 'Walking With Christ, We Love and Serve our Church and Neighbors' with our Guiding Principles and start implementing them.

Thank you for all your feedback and cooperation throughout this process. We will inform you for any progress we make.

As our grandmas used to say "many hands make light work". This has been such a successful ministry for the committee. The last packing event packed over 200 bags of snacks.

MUSIC NOTES

It occurred to me you might be interested to know how we come up with the hymns for our services. Unlike what some might suspect, we don't put a big chart on the wall and throw darts! We use the same sources for all the Sunday services – the main being a book called *Indexes* which lists suggested hymns for a particular day, eg. the third Sunday after Easter in Year B. (Our lectionary is on a three year cycle - A, B or C - and we're currently in a B year.) We also use other sources such as *Sundays and Seasons*, and occasionally suggested music from Augusburg-Fortress or Concordia publishers.

Pastor Bimen and I serve on both groups, of course, and the Celebration Services are also currently planned by Joyce Anderson and Mike Barney. The traditional service planners include Becky Miller and Shirley Williamson. We usually manage to choose hymns for two to three months at a sitting, which takes a couple of hours, so you can see that thought and discussion go into each Sunday's plans.

Note: Some of the above information comes from Paul Westermeyer's *Hymnal Companion to mEvangelical Lutheran Worship* published by Auguburg Fortress in 2010.
