Summer greetings to you my siblings in Christ,
Our current bishop Bill Gafkjend recites the verses above
quite often over for the last at least thirteen years of his
ministry as bishop of the Indiana-Kentucky synod. Those
words are God's Words spoken through the prophet Isaiah
calling his people to not dwell in the glory of the past, but to

focus on the present and future that God is doing and continues to a new thing. The same message our bishop calls our attentions to throughout his tenure as bishop of our synod. God indeed is doing a new thing and will continue to do so, whether we see or perceive it. To see and perceive what God is doing is a privilege and blessing. To see and perceive what God is doing need intentionality by taking our time to dwell in his word, prayer, meditation, contemplation, discernment and action.

In our synod assembly this year focused on just that. The theme for the assembly was, 'Waiting, Watching and Working'. We had three keynote speakers that talked about each topic. Each topic is also in a right order. It is interesting that 'working' is the last in that order. We often jump into action without first waiting and watching. The first thing is to wait and to wait patiently, actively and purposely. In waiting, as the speaker said, needs practice and discipline but it also builds trust and gives us hope. The speaker shared about the wisdom of waiting, just like the early Christians who waited patiently even through their struggles with persecutions and yet, the church continued to grow. The second important step is to watch and watch attentively.

Harding The Bible is full of God's signs for his people watch as his way of bringing his message to his people such as the rainbow, the burning bush, the valley of the dry bones, the stars of Bethlehem etc., God's signs are also all around us that we need to open our eyes to see and watch what God is doing. That leads us into the last step, 'working'. One thing that was being emphasized that was not included in that theme was the word 'together'. Together is a key word. We wait, watch and work together as congregation or synod. In fact, the word 'synod' means 'walk alongside together'.

As the result of our 'waiting, watching and working' together, we were able to elect our new bishop; Pr. Tim Graham. The process indeed required those steps. It took five ballots to have an election. The election of the bishop is quite interesting. It is called 'ecclesiastical ballot'; a process that our early church used to elect their leaders that distinguished them from secular process of electing a spiritual leader. We used that model to elect our council president too. Below is the description of the process as stated in our synod's constitution for your own records:

S9.04. "The bishop shall be elected by the Synod Assembly by ecclesiastical ballot. Three-fourths of the votes cast shall be necessary for election on the first ballot. If no one is elected, the first ballot shall be considered the nominating ballot. Three-fourths of the votes cast on the second ballot shall be necessary for election. The third ballot shall be limited to the seven persons (plus ties) who received the greatest number of votes on the second ballot, and two-thirds of the votes cast shall be necessary for election. The fourth ballot shall be limited to the three persons (plus ties) who receive the greatest number of votes on the third ballot, and 60 percent of the votes cast shall be necessary for election. On subsequent ballots a majority of the votes cast shall be necessary for election. These ballots shall be limited to the two persons (plus ties) that receive the greatest number of votes on the previous ballot."

SOCIAL MINISTRY OUTREACH

THANK YOU to everyone who donated to our Snack Pack Initiative. On Sunday, June 16th we were able to pack 200 snack packs. TWO HUNDRED packs....that means 200 hundred individuals will receive a pack of snacks to help relieve feelings of hunger. Think about that number...200. Two hundred one gallon Ziploc bags filled with 1 can of Vienna Sausages, 1 cup of apple sauce, 1 cup of pudding, 1 fruit bar, 1 package of peanut butter crackers, 1 bag of chips, a spoon and a wet nap. What a blessing to those who struggle with less than this every day.





With your donations and help from Thrivent Grant cards Roger Miller was able to purchase all the supplies. The total cost was just around \$400, which works out to \$2 per snack pack. Just \$2. Think about that, just \$2 is able to help someone in need. Wouldn't it be awesome to increase the number of packs assembled in the future? For every \$20, 10 packs are assembled and 10 people are helped!

We partner with the United Methodist Church of Fern Creek for this initiative. They come and pick up our boxes of packs and head out to the homeless camps.

Something so simple...snacks, the same snacks that we go to our pantry for without thinking



about is having an impact on someone's life. This initiative is definitely living up to our church's mission....walking with Christ, to love and serve our church and NEIGHBORS!



Did you know that Christ Lutheran, with funding from the Memorial Committee, has purchased pickleball courts that can be set up in the gym.


Open courts are available on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 12pm-2pm-unless there is a scheduled event in the gym.




ROCK PAINTING EVENT FOR GASLIGHT FESTIVAL
